Saikolone's Reflection

Matthew 25:31-46

The cycle of our Christian year comes to an end with a festival that celebrates and proclaims Christ's lordship over all things. The intention of this celebration is to celebrate that Jesus is the Lord of all, and the hope was that one day Jesus will rule the world. The way of Jesus will be the way of the world.

It seems to me that common longing we have, as humans is the longing to be worthy of the best reward after we die, or a longing to be all right after we die. As Christians, we all want to be very sure that we are worthy of God's eternal reward. It is important to us as Christians that we will be rewarded with the best price of eternal life.

In this parable of the sheep and the goats in Matthew 25:31-46, the scene is the final judgment in which the Son of Man sits on his throne and judges the people. The criterion for the disposition of each case is simple: how did the person in question treat the needy? All that matters is the way the defendant treated others. It is especially noteworthy that those who were condemned to eternal punishment are not accused of actively persecuting the poor, the homeless, or the prisoners but the accusation is that those condemned people did nothing explicit to help those in need.

So, for those who are longing to make sure they are going to be eternally rewarded, what we do to others is the base of our reward, according to Matthew's Jesus.

This parable also tells us that these people are Jesus, and what we do to them, we do to him, what we do to the 32,000 children who die from starvation each day in our world, we do to Jesus.

There are always those who don't care about the others and the implication of what they do to others. Sometimes we ignore people's plea for help because we too have our burdens to deal with. But do we make a noise against those policies that contribute to the plight of the poor?

We need to own that not only are we to give ourselves to those in need but also we are to recognize than in many ways the needs which envelop others have been caused by us.

At the end of the old year and as we start the new year - we look back upon our missed opportunities and failures, at the many graces we have experienced in these last 365 days and we celebrate the second chance we now have to find those who are waiting for us.

Lord Jesus Christ, "Send us. Empower us. Give us the joy and the courage to love others as if they were you." Amen

Methodist Conference 2023 Report By Saikolone Taufa

2023 Methodist Conference was held on Zoom, starting on Monday, 6th of November until Saturday 11th of November. It was attended by 104 ministers, 1 deacon, 9 ministers from Other Churches Serving the Methodist Conference, 81 lay reps and 35 as observers.

Here are some of the decisions that might have some impact for our Parish.

Decade of Climate Justice

Conference 2022 passed a decision that the whole of the Methodist Church of New Zealand will engage in the next ten years on a mission to heal and restore the damage that our human community has contributed to our environment. The theme of the Decade is "Rekindle the Vā of Papatūānuku".

The Climate Justice Working Group (CJWG) has worked hard to progress initiatives in the decade and the CJWG has established a pathway to take the church on this journey for the next ten years. There are two yearly themes to guide the Church: Zero Waste, 2023-2024; Climate Migrants, 2025-2026; Water, 2027-2028; Improving energy efficiency, 2029-2030; Poverty reduction/ food creation and sharing, 2031-2032.

In the next two years the Church will work on ways that would assist us in minimizing waste that would potentially end up in the landfill or in the sea. The synods, parishes and rohe were encouraged to look for ways that would help them to avoid waste by introducing practical ways of reusing, recycling, reducing, and replacing some of our existing materials to prevent waste from being scattered in the community and obviously end up in the sea or rivers.

Property Strategy

Conference 2022 asked Methodist Church Property Committee (MCPC) to establish a skilled National Committee to develop a property strategy for the Methodist Church of New Zealand.

A small group has met this year (2023) to commence the development of a Connexional property strategy to ensure property is an effective resource to continue to fully support ministry, mission, pastoral, and community requirements of the Methodist Church in Aotearoa.

Conference 2023 asked the Working Group to continue their work on the Property Strategy, to seek input from the wider Connexion, and report back to Conference in 2024.

Review of the Disciplinary Regulations

The work of Law Revision since 2022 Conference has focused primarily on the revision of the Disciplinary Procedures in Section 8 of the Law Book. In August of 2023 a wānanga was held to develop a framework for the proposed changes to the procedures. At the wananga, they looked at the conceptual underpinnings of a restorative approach to relationship breakdown.

Conference 2023 notes the draft review of the committee of the disciplinary code of Section 8 of the law book will be sent to Synods and Hui Poari for comment. There will be ongoing work and consultation on the changes for Conference approval in 2024.

Touchstone:

Conference 2023 affirmed that Touchstone be available online in a magazine style format with links sent via a wide email distribution list. In addition to links directing readers to the online version, a reduced version of the publication has been produced as a printable PDF for readers unable to access or use the online option.

MCNZ Conference 2023 Statement of Solidarity with Palestine:

Conference 2023 agreed that the Methodist Church of New Zealand make a statement of solidarity with Palestine. The statement was distributed to the wider church.


